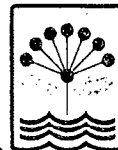

5.0 RELEVANT PLANS

Drilling bores or holes – why is a resource consent required?

Section nine of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) provides for the regulation of activities that disturb land, such as drilling bores or holes.

The activity may be subject to rules in both the Auckland Transitional Regional Plan 1991 (TRP) and the Proposed Auckland Regional Plan: Air, Land and Water (PARP:ALW). As all the relevant provisions of the PARP:ALW are not yet operative, the status of the activity is determined as the more restrictive of the relevant rules of both plans.

Definition of a bore

Any hole that has been constructed to provide access to groundwater (for example, for monitoring of ground or groundwater conditions, abstraction of groundwater or the discharge of stormwater). This definition includes piezometers but excludes piezometers that are constructed into manmade structures such as dams and the refuse in landfills.

Drilling is carried out for geotechnical, geological and hydrogeological investigations, monitoring, installing underground services, installing water bores and for a wide variety of other purposes.

Groundwater quality can be degraded by drilling, constructing and sealing new bores and by poor operation, maintenance and/or abandonment of existing bores. This can occur through introducing contaminated waters, cross-aquifer contamination by linking aquifers of different water quality and linking surface water and groundwater of different quality.

Degrading groundwater quality can indirectly affect the quantity of water available, while poorly installed bores can also dewater aquifers.

5.0 RELEVANT PLANS contd

Chapter six, Water Allocation of the PARP:ALW (June 2005) deals with issues associated with water quality and allocation, that is:

- the taking and use, of fresh water and geothermal water;
- the damming of surface water;
- the diversion of groundwater; and
- the quantity, level and flow of water in any water body.

Drilling is also addressed in chapter six because of its association with the taking of groundwater. Diversion of stormwater is addressed in chapter five and diversion of rivers and streams in chapter seven of the Plan.

If the bore is intended for taking water, then it is important to know whether the bore is in a High Use Aquifer Management Area (HUAMA) which are identified on the PARP:ALW October 2004 Map Series two (sheets 1-19). They are described in section 3.5 of the PARP:ALW.

The proposed bore construction and final drillers bore log will also assist in determining if your bore abstracts water from a high use aquifer. Talk to Council staff if you are uncertain.

8.0 CONSULTATION

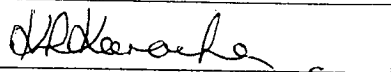

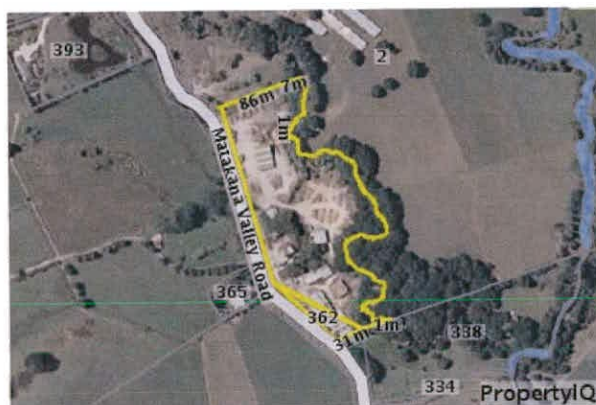
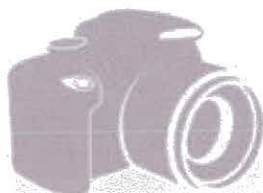
